

Getting Around the Metro Area

Public transportation around the metro area got a little bit easier on July 26 when the Metro Silver Line opened five new stations in our direction. Decades over-due, the line branches off from the Orange Line's East Falls Church station and stops at McLean, Tysons Corner, Greensboro, Spring Hill, and Wiehle-Reston East. The second phase of construction will continue the Silver Line to Dulles Airport with anticipated completion in 2018.

All Silver Line stations will have bus service. While our nearest bus stop is a robust walk down Hiddenbrook Drive to Dranesville Road, Kingston Chase is fortunate to have this reasonable option of catching the bus and then taking the rail into Washington DC and other stations on the Metro line, including National Airport and Union Station.

The web has a wealth of information to help with navigating the bus and rail service. If you are not aware, the bus service in our area rivals those counties that are inside the Beltway. Once school is completed, practices are held in the mornings from 8:00-10:00 a.m. Meets are held on Wednesday nights and Saturday mornings. As the swim season wraps up, the swimmers always look forward to the end-of-year party and paper plate awards. Swimmers are congratulated with a medal and "special" paper plate for their accomplishments. Every year two swimmers, a boy and a girl, are awarded the "high point trophy award" for the most points received during the season. This year, Sierra Platt and Charlie Kucik received those awards. In addition, the coaches give out two trophies to swimmers who have demonstrated great sportsmanship and team spirit. This year Joel Anderson and Annabell Rogers received those awards. 


