The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) met on August 6 to review the following applications:

- <u>Lot</u> <u>Approved</u>
- 176 Replace front door with similar fiberglass door (same color).
- 256 Replace broken mailbox post with similar wooden post.
- 298 Change the color of the shutters and door trim from red to midnight blue.
- 317 Install a solar attic fan.
- Change front steps from cement to red brick. Replace front walkway with bricks. Install black wrought iron banister.
- Replace roof with Timberline HD shingles in Hickory color. Replace windows in white vinyl and add grids to all panels.
- 418 Enclose rear porch to create addition to house. All siding to match existing.

Trees, shrubbery and vines must not hang over the sidewalk less than seven (7) feet, even when raining, for the entire width of sidewalk. 
