## Spring Yard Chores Are Fast Approaching

**P** reparing your yard for spring is essential for keeping the lawn/landscape healthy when the summer heat won't let up. The key to having and keeping a vibrant lawn is to act before any signs of stress present themselves. Preparation beforehand goes a long way and your lawn will show its appreciation to your attentiveness.

- 1. To start, begin with a yard assessment. The winter months may have left behind dead tree limbs, leaves, and dead grass. You may need to begin by just picking up the debris so you can see your lawn and be able to assess everything from the soil to your outdoor furniture and structures.
- 2. Before you start work on the yard, evaluate your lawnmower and tools. Give your mower a good cleaning and start it up to check the engine performance. You may need to sharpen blades, check cords, change the oil, and other maintenance to be sure you are ready to go when the grass begins to grow.
- 3. Start by simply raking your grass. Get out all the clumps and dead grass and allows for the sunshine to reach the lawn. This timely raking stimulates and awakens the grass. Clean out the beds and trim back any dead branches. Use a hardwood mulch for your beds. Mulch is needed to protect the soil from moisture and help guard against weeds. Many homeowners also like the appearance of a mulched yard.
- 4. Crabgrass is the enemy of your lawn! Proper fertilization is critical to maintaining a beautiful landscape with healthy turf or plantings. Certain fertilizers are dangerous and harmful, so plan to avoid chemical products as much as possible. Fertilizing helps increase the lawn's ability to resist insects and pests, plant diseases, and promote plant growth and strength.

Keep in mind that shrub fertilization is especially important for plants in the first five years of maturity and that smaller plantings will require more supplemental feeding than larger established trees. If you feel overwhelmed, there are an abundance of lawn and landscape experts that can take a look at your property and offer recommendations for improvement and success.


