

Remember to keep your dogs leashed

A resident has reached out to the KCHOA Board regarding dogs off-leash in the neighborhood.

A reminder to Kingston Chase residents: In Fairfax County, dogs are required to be on a leash at all times in public areas unless they're in a designated off-leash area.

Fairfax County code states:

Section 41.1-2-4. Unrestricted dogs prohibited; leash law. (a) No dog shall run unrestricted, as defined in Section 41.1-1-1, in the County.

Unrestricted means not under the control of the owner or his agent either by leash, cord, chain, or primary enclosure when off the property or premises of the owner or custodian.

Sidewalk Maintenance

Who is responsible for sidewalk maintenance?

The structure of our sidewalks is county property, and cracked or broken concrete should be reported to the county by calling 703-877-2800. However, maintenance of all edges and seams are the homeowner's responsibility. If plant growth is appearing in sidewalk seams or cracks in front of your property, please remove it promptly to continue to keep the neighborhood safe and clean. These unexpected grassy humps trip walkers, joggers, and tricycle riders as well as cause structural problems when the roots spread under the concrete.

The strip of grass between the sidewalk and street (where mailboxes enter the ground) is also each homeowner's responsibility to keep mowed and edged. Any landscaping around the mailbox should be kept neat and should not protrude into the sidewalk, over the curb, or obstruct the front of the mailbox in any way.

Applications: Any change to the exterior of the house or property (front, back or sides) requires an ARC application before work begins. The only exceptions are landscaping and lawn ornaments less than two feet tall. When applying, please include with the application the house plot and details, and pictures of the colors and materials to be used in the project.

Fences: All fences require an application. Kingston Chase allows board-on-board fences with no overlapping boards, estate fences and picket fences. Stockade fences are not allowed and will not be approved.

Sheds: All sheds require an application. Sheds may not be more than 8.5 feet tall at their peak and must have an area of 160 square feet or less. Homeowners are encouraged to choose shed designs and colors that match the house and are in keeping with the earth tones found throughout the neighborhood.

Driveway Extensions: Driveway extensions require an ARC application and are considered on a case-bycase basis. They are rarely approved. Driveways cannot extend past the edge of the garage and Fairfax County does not allow any alteration to the apron, the piece of concrete or asphalt that connects the road, the sidewalk, and the driveway.

Resident actress earns lead role in 'High School Musical Jr.'






