With schools back in session and with students and buses moving about the neighborhood each morning and afternoon, Kingston Chase residents and guests are once again urged to use caution, remain focused and obey speed limits and stop signs.

This is particularly true during morning rush hour. Oft-distracted drivers, perhaps bound for work, tend to zip through the neighborhood, sometimes barely slowing at stop signs, and in some cases ignoring buses with red lights flashing.

Parents should also remind their children to be extra vigilant and aware of traffic on their way to school or when boarding and exiting buses.

Dogs will get their day at KC pool

Get ready to unleash your good boys and girls for some end-of-summer fun as Dog Day at the Pool is set for Saturday, Sept. 16, from noon to 2 p.m.

A waiver form must be signed prior to entering the pool deck with your dog. Forms will be available on site. Dogs must be up to date on vaccinations, and should generally be friendly or tolerant of other dogs.

Humans must be 12 or older to enter the deck, and NO humans will be allowed in the water, as there will be no lifeguard on duty, and the water will not have been tested.

Dog owners may bring throw toys, but it might be best to bring one you wouldn't be too sad to lose.

Welcome to the many new families who have joined the Kingston Chase community this spring and summer! For your reference, and for anyone else interested in a refresher, the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) would like to provide a quick review of the most commonly received applications and questions. For the complete ARC Guidelines, please visit www.kchoa.org/architectural-review-committee.

Applications: Any change to the exterior of the house or property (front, back or sides) requires an ARC application before work begins. The only exceptions are landscaping and lawn ornaments less than two feet tall. When applying, please include with the application the house plot and details, and pictures of the colors and materials to be used in the project.

Fences: All fences require an application. Kingston Chase allows board-on-board fences with no overlapping boards, estate fences and picket fences. Stockade fences are not allowed and will not be approved.


